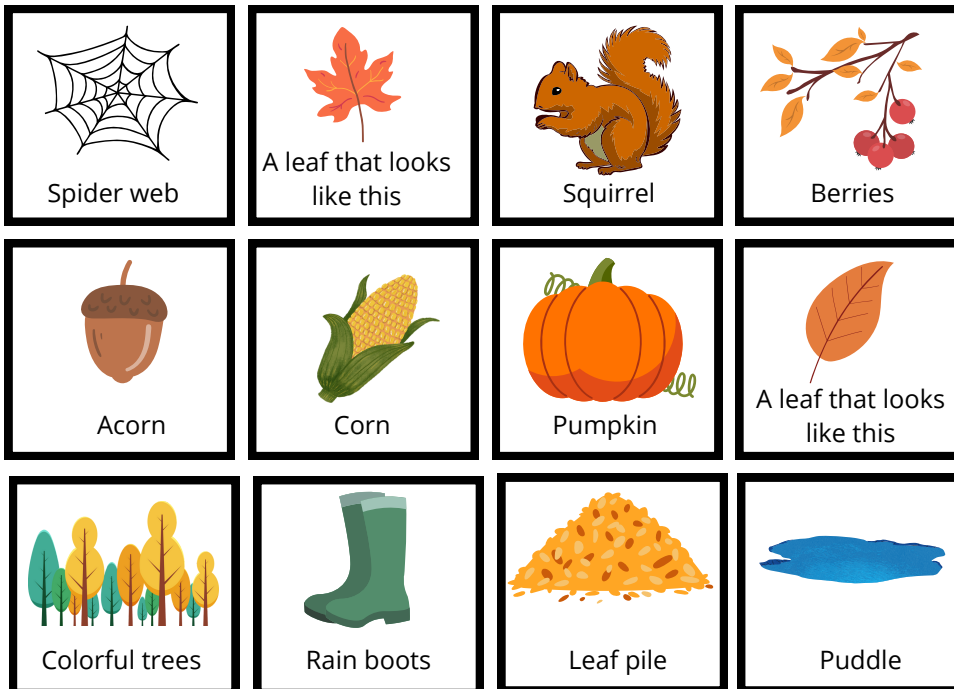

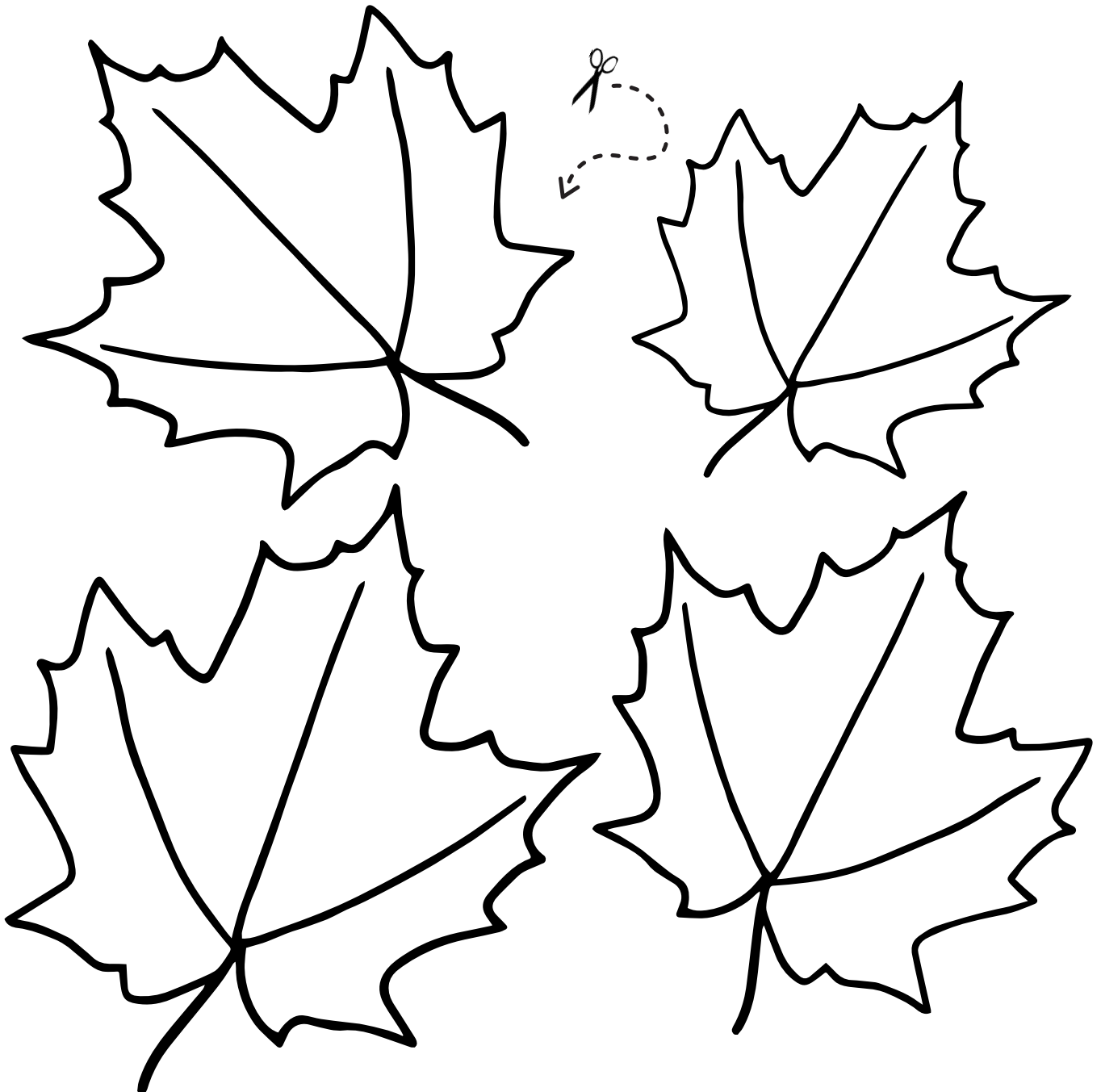
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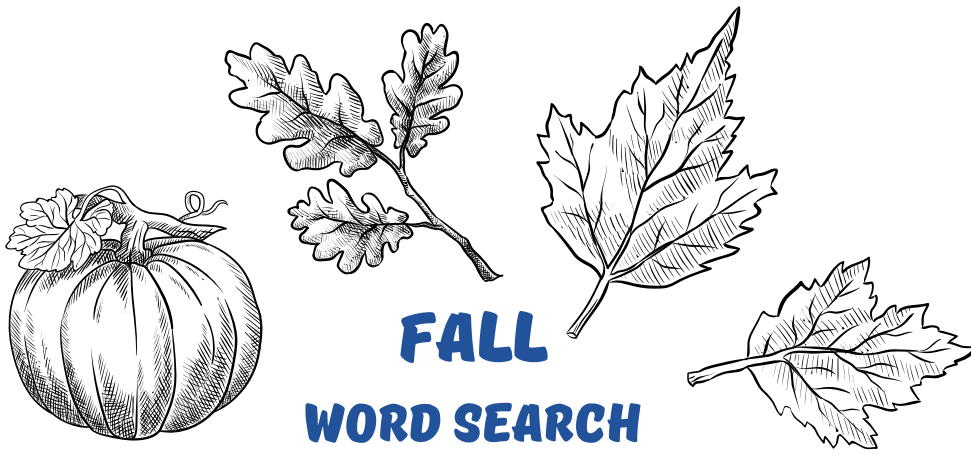


FALLEN LEAVES GARLAND

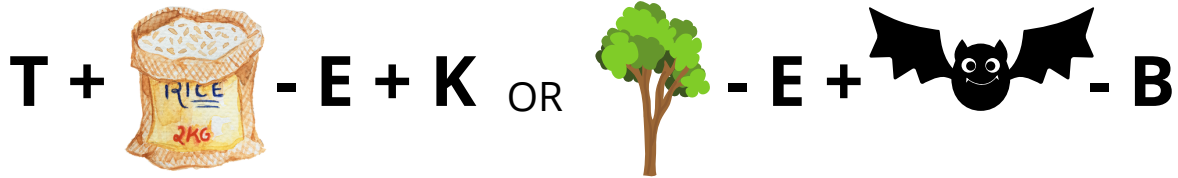

A Spanish fairy tale retold by Clever Hedgehog



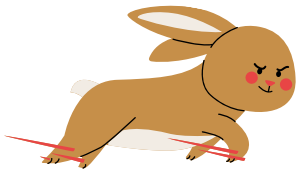
Listen to a story that Clever Hedgehog once heard from his grandfather:
